NEW DEVELOPMENTS FOR THE IJD

The end of 2023 brought exciting developments for International Journal of Dermatology (IJD), with the recent transition of the Editorial Rochester. from Minnesota, to Szeged, Hungary, and the various staff and process changes that move entailed. Our incoming Editorial Team was formally introduced at the ISD Sister Society Meeting of the annual EADV Congress in Berlin (11-14 October 2023). A meeting was also held for Section Editors and the ISD Executive Committee discuss the to journal's current performance and targets for the near future.

Under our leadership, IJD continues to be a hybrid journal enabling authors to publish free of charge, while offering open access as an alternate publication route. Although we recognize journal metrics as an effective evaluation tool, the journal maintains its inclusive approach, aiming to provide valuable opportunities underserved communities and authors presenting neglected tropical diseases.

To facilitate publication, we have introduced a new submission site. restructured the fields we

cover within dermatology and venereology, and updated our author guidelines accordingly.

We intend to interact with the growing audience around the journal and ISD via social media, as well as publish engaging content that encourages the scientific community to further enhance their knowledge. We are eager to see how emerging technologies are going reshape the landscape of medical research and publishing in the coming years.

MENTEES ON THE MOVE

What can happen in one month of ISD mentorship? Find out from Andery Mun, MD, our first mentee from Uzbekistan, about the experiences he gained from spending a month with Prof. Dedee Murrell at the University of New South Wales, Australia:

What were your major goals for your mentorship experience?

I had several goals: the first one was to gain knowledge and skills in clinical dermatology practice and dermatology research projects; the second was to establish a collegial relationship with one of the best dermatologists.

What did you like best about your mentorship experience?

I appreciated the innovation and individual approach to each patient. Also, I was able to discuss and communicate with Prof. Murrell equally, possible only because of her personality. Prof. Murrell is intelligent, easygoing, sincere, has a great sense of humor, and shares all her experience and knowledge.

Describe any special experiences with your mentor:

I was able to observe lots of patients with challenging conditions, about 50 cases per week. Thus, I became more experienced in bullous diseases and new biological treatments of psoriasis, atopic dermatitis and hidradenitis suppurativa, which will be very helpful back in Uzbekistan.

Describe a skill acquired during your mentorship that you will definitely use when you return home:

During my mentorship with Prof. Murrell, I saw different kinds of diseases, especially skin cancers. Now I am more experienced in dermoscopy, cryosurgery, skin surgery and biologic treatments, which I can definitely employ in Uzbekistan.

How will your mentorship experience impact your patient care and professional goals over the next year? Having observed the connection Prof. Murrell creates with a patient and heard her recommendations. I noticed very good compliance resulting from the good relationship between doctor and patient. Also, applying a lot of assessment indexes helps monitor treatment. I will utilize all of these things in my clinical practice.



How will your mentorship experience make an impact five years from now, including for your region or country?

I think the knowledge and practical skills will have an impact not only over the next five years, but my whole life. I will share my experience with my colleagues and my students, and it will also be a benefit for my patients.

Share a pearl you learned during your mentorship experience:

I learned about whole body dermoscopy for skin cancer management.

As a dermatologist at the Civil Service Hospital in Kathmandu, Nepal, I am passionate about making a difference through medical education and skill development for rural health care practitioners. I practice in a resource-restrained setting limited by a lack of infrastructure, of a robust patient data system, and of experts in dermatology's super-specialty fields. I sought a mentorship with Prof. Dedee Murrell, Chair of Dermatology at St George Hospital, UNSW Faculty of Medicine in Sydney, Australia, because she is a world-renowned expert and leader in medical dermatology, autoimmune blistering disorders, epidermolysis bullosa and therapeutic clinical trials.

Various take-home pearls I relish are Prof. Murrell's insightful lectures on specific diseases; using AI in detection and treatment; presenting my recommendations.

Attending a clinical dermatology conference at a partner institute provided insights on rare skin diseases and their management. These activities were invaluable for my education, networking, and brainstorming for collaborating on future research after returning to Nepal.

I also benefited by observing how Prof. Murrell balances multicultural cooperation, academic prowess, scientific integrity, compassion, empathy, and the art of dermatology. My exposure to her has inspired me to be involved in training the next generation of dermatologists back home; I hope to be involved in ISD leadership opportunities and to be a mentor myself in the future.

Beyond dermatology rounds, clinics, and research, I also had the chance to try kayaking, motor boating and swimming with Prof. Murrell and her husband! These experiences broadened my perspective on life even further, reiterating that dermatology and research are only a small part of our multi-faceted lives.


